Watch Hashknife Pony Express Complete 200-mile Journey to Deliver Mail on February 10

The Hashknife Pony Express makes its ride every year, traveling from Holbrook to Scottsdale and delivering 20,000 first-class letters by horseback. The ride is led by the Navajo County Hashknife Sheriff's Posse. More than two dozen riders in authentic cowboy clothing carry the mail. The ride ends in Scottsdale at high noon on Friday February 10 with riders delivering the mail to U.S. Postal Service representatives near the front steps of the Museum of the West at 2nd St and Marshall Way. The public is invited to greet the riders. Cost is free.

The Parada del Sol Parade and Trails End Festival Takes Place Saturday February 11, 10 AM to 6 PM The parade begins at 10 AM on Scottsdale Rd south of Camelback and weaves through downtown Scottsdale. Thoughts on Travel: Choosing Your Travel Dates

Whether you travel within the United States or abroad, you will want to think about when to go. You may not have a choice if you are attending a specific event, but if you have flexibility you can think about climate, popularity, airfares, etc.



A little research on the internet can show you when the weather is most likely to be favorable for your activities. In Scandinavia you might want to enjoy the long summer days or you might prefer the icy darkness and northern lights in winter. Since most travelers visit Scandinavia in summer the airfares, hotels, transportation, etc. will be far more expensive. Conversely, most people visit the Caribbean in winter.

In between the high and low seasons is the shoulder season of spring and fall. Airfares and accommodations are much less than high season, but higher than low season. Another advantage of shoulder season is easier availability of attractions without the long lines and crowds of high season.

If traveling by air, fares may be higher or lower to the same destination depending on the day of the week you fly. In my November column I stated that in general medical insurance does not cover you when you leave the United States. This is true of Medicare. However, a thoughtful resident called to let me know that certain Medicare supplemental plans do offer limited coverage outside the U.S.)

Butternut Soufflé Preheat oven to 325

2 c cooked mashed butternut squash. 3 T butter, 1 C sugar or % C honey, 1/3 C milk, % t salt, 1 t ground cinnamon, % t ground nutmeg, 3 eggs 1 t vanilla extract

Combine squash and butter, mixing well. Add sugar, milk, and spices; mix thoroughly. Add eggs, beating well. Stir in vanilla.

Pour mixture into a greased 1-1/2 qt casserole. Bake at 325 for 1 hr and 15 min or until set. Yield:6-8 servings.

Motion to approve the Swimming Pool Service & Repair proposal for \$7,070.00 to make the specified pool repairs. Seconded. Discussion followed. Approved 5 to 0, Ms. Lear and Ms. Besson abstained.
